

# **PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATIONS IN LAW REGULATIONS 2008**

## **AMENDMENT 2014**

### **1. Name and Commencement**

- (1) These regulations are the Professional Examinations in Law Amendment Regulations 2014, and shall be read together with and form part of the Professional Examinations in Law Regulations 2008 (the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December 2014.

### **2. Amendment to Regulation 1**

Regulation 1(3) is amended by inserting after the definition of Council the definition of “Faculty of Law” to read: “Faculty of Law includes School of Law”.

### **3. Insertion of Regulation 9A**

Regulation 9A and its heading are inserted after regulation 9:

#### **“REVIEW**

#### **9A Review of Overseas Law Qualifications Assessment Decisions**

- (1) An Applicant may apply to the Chairperson of the Council to review a determination under regulations 8 or 9.
- (2) Every applicant for review must be in writing and:
  - (a) identify the grounds for review;
  - (b) include any information or documents the applicant wants the Council to consider, in addition to information or documents already provided;
  - (c) be accompanied by the prescribed fee.
- (3) An applicant does not have a right to attend any meeting, or to make oral submissions to the Chairperson when undertaking the review.

- (4) When undertaking a review, the Chairperson may exercise all of the powers and discretions the Council was able to exercise when it made the original determination under regulations 8 or 9, and may:
  - (a) affirm the determination;
  - (b) vary the determination; or
  - (c) set aside the determination and make a new determination.
- (5) The Chairperson will give the applicant written notice of the determination on the application for review, and that decision will be final.”

**4. Insertion of Heading**

A major heading “**TIME LIMITATIONS**” is inserted above the heading of regulation 10.
